Professional Development for Faculty and Staff

Before the arrival of students, our teachers received training in different areas of school-wide curricular improvements. Among these workshops we had:

Atlas Curriculum System

ATLAS Curriculum System is a cloud-based curriculum management system that helps schools and districts to design, implement, and assess their curriculum. It provides a central place to store and manage all aspects of the curriculum, including standards, lessons, assessments, and resources. ATLAS Curriculum system is used by over 6,000 schools and districts around the world.






Social Emotional Learning (SEL) training sessions by CASEL (The Collaborative for Academic, Social, and Emotional Learning) in order to help make evidence-based social and emotional learning an integral part of Washington Academy education from Preschool through High School.

International Baccalaureate's (IB) Middle Years Programme (MYP) Planning

These professional development opportunities for faculty and staff allow them to learn about and develop the skills necessary to plan and deliver the MYP curriculum effectively. As some of you may already know, the MYP is a challenging academic program that encourages students to become critical thinkers and lifelong learners. It is designed for students aged 11-16 and is offered in schools around the world.





Differentiation and Inclusion in the Classroom

Differentiation is the process of tailoring instruction to meet the individual needs of all students. It involves providing students with different learning opportunities, based on their readiness, interests, and learning styles. On the other hand, Inclusion is the practice of educating all students in the general education classroom, regardless of their abilities. It is based on the belief that all students can learn and succeed together, and that all students deserve to be part of the same learning community. Differentiation and inclusion are two important concepts in education. When used together, they can create a classroom environment where all students feel supported and challenged, and where all students have the opportunity to succeed.

Artificial Intelligence (AI) in the Classroom


This in-person workshop taught our teachers and staff how to use AI to improve teaching and learning. These sessions cover a variety of topics, such as:

- What is AI and how does it work?
- The different types of AI that can be used in the classroom
- How to use AI to personalize learning?
- How to use AI to assess student progress?



- Teachers learn how to use AI to personalize learning and meet the needs of all learners.
- They also gain access to new AI tools and resources that can be used to create engaging and interactive learning experiences.
- Faculty and staff discover best practices for using AI ethically and responsibly in the classroom.
- They connect with other educators who are interested in using AI to improve teaching and learning.

Backward Unit Design Training Sessions



Backward Unit Design in education is a curriculum planning process that starts with the desired results, or learning goals, and then works backward to plan the assessment and learning experiences that will help students achieve those goals. This approach is in contrast to the traditional approach of starting with the content to be covered and then designing the assessment and learning experiences around that content. Backward unit design has a number of benefits, including:

- It helps teachers focus on the most important things students need to
- It ensures that assessment and instruction are aligned.
- It provides a clear roadmap for learning.
- It helps teachers make better use of their time and resources.
- It leads to improved student learning outcomes.
